

PROGRAM TITLE:	Prosthodontic Preceptorship at Eastman Institute for Oral Health
COURSE CO-DIRECTORS:	Drs. Heeje Lee, Carlo Ercoli
COURSE DATES AND DURATION:	11 months (generally divided into 2 semesters (fall and spring). Expected start date is August 1 st of each year.
OBJECTIVES:	To promote the dissemination of EIOH prosthodontic educational model To be exposed to prosthodontic education at the postgraduate level To learn current concepts of prosthodontics To understand how to advance interdisciplinary treatment planning To understand how technology can be incorporated into prosthodontics To understand and apply basic research methodology in prosthodontics
PROGRAM FORMAT:	The student will be involved in all didactic activities held in the prosthodontic program at EIOH; this generally involve lectures, courses, CE activities, seminars, resident and faculty-led literature reviews, interdisciplinary case presentations and treatment planning, problem-based learning, long-distance presentations and remote (via Blackboard or similar) types of lecture delivery media. It is also expected that the student will participate in scholarly activity that are on-going within the program with the purpose of learning basic research methodology and design.
PATIENT CONTACT:	It is expected that the student will observe clinical procedure performed in the Prosthodontic Clinic. However, the student will not be allowed to provide patient care.
SIZE OF CLASS:	1-3 depending on application number and eligible candidates. It is expected that the first one or two classes will enroll 1-2 students.
CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY:	DDS degree from a CODA-accredited or equivalent foreign institution. While we expect this program to be open, in the long-term, to dentist from different countries, it is planned that, for the first three years, we will enroll dentists from South Korea.
TUITION:	US \$ 25,000 + applicable mandatory health insurance fees, administration fees. All subject to change without notice.
CERTIFICATE:	A certificate is awarded upon successful completion of the program. Please note: this program is not intended to prepare individuals to practice a specialty. It is not the same as the postgraduate program certificate awarded to full-time postgraduate students in specialty training as a qualification for recognition by the American Dental Association, nor does it qualify an individual for licensure in New York State or any other state in the United States.

METHODS OF EVALUATION:

Student/s will be required to undergo a semester examination that will encompass the information provided during the lectures.

A case-based scenario will be provided, on a semester calendar and the student assessed in his ability to apply sound and evidence-based knowledge to a clinical case.
