Rodent Cesarean Section Rederivation Estimate of Charges (FY 24-25)

The cost depends on the number of rodents acquired. Please contact DLAMTechs@urmc.rochester.edu with questions.

Cesarean section (C-section) rederivation services are available for situations in which rodents need to be acquired from sources with health histories incompatible with specific pathogen free (SPF) standards required by the University of Rochester. Founder mice are imported into a restricted housing room and maintained by the DCM staff. Mice are bred (paired once weekly) and closely monitored throughout pregnancy. C-section is performed on founder dams and pups are transferred to foster dams with a verified health status. DCM manages these offspring until the time of release from quarantine. Timeline from importation arrival to quarantine release is highly variable but requires *at least* 14-16 weeks total. A meeting must be scheduled with a DCM veterinarian prior to beginning this process to discuss your needs and design a rederivation plan.
