Extreme Risk Protection Orders: A New Gun Violence Prevention Tool for Healthcare

Firearm related injuries are the leading cause of death among U.S. youth aged 1-19 years. Extreme Risk Protection Orders (ERPO), known as Red Flag Laws, are a prevention tool that has effectively prevented suicide, mass shootings, including school shootings, and intimate partner homicide. ERPO is a civil court order that temporarily prevents a person at extreme risk of harming themselves or others and who is behaving dangerously from possessing or purchasing firearms.
