

DIRECTOR'S REPORT FOR 1988

Progress and planning were two of the hallmarks of the Center's activities in 1988. We made good progress on most fronts: our educational programs flourished and the number and quality of applicants increased, research productivity was excellent and extramural research support reached an all-time high, and patient care activity showed a gratifying increase.

Education

Our programs showed evolutionary change without any alteration in numbers or focus. In spite of the substantial national reduction in numbers of dental school graduates over the past several years, applications to our programs continue to increase in number and quality. A special program to increase recruitment of minorities into General Dentistry was funded by the federal government and met with considerable success as minority applications to our program increased by fifty percent.

One of the measures of a program's quality is the success of its students and graduates in national and other competitions, and we have several such distinctions to report. Dr. Mariane Bafile, an alumna and current faculty member, won the John J. Sharry Research Prize of the American College of Prosthodontists, while Dr. Izchak Barzilay won first prize in that College's Essay competition. Dr. Urs Zappa, a recent graduate of our Periodontal program won the Swiss Kiwanis Prize for Published Research and Dr. Jeffrey Young, another recent graduate, won the essay competition of the New York State Association of Pediatric Dentistry.


Research

Research flourished with record extramural support, 70 percent of which came from the National Institutes of Health (N.I.H.) and the remainder from industry. As will be seen from the list at the end of this report, a record number of publications by the Center's staff appeared in the scientific literature. Thanks to a major N.I.H. grant to Dr. John Featherstone, we were able to obtain a stateof-the-art scanning electron microscope. This and other equipment purchases help us keep in step with rapidly changing technologies, although this continues to be a difficult challenge.

Among the many research advances by EDC researchers, are some of general interest:

• An intra-oral device has been developed for slow-release agents which can potentially be used to treat not only caries but a variety of other diseases.

- Pre-treatment with certain constituents of saliva can reduce the acid solubility of tooth enamel by 70 percent.
- Smooth surfaces caries are prevented when fluoride is present in either diet or drinking water. To prevent sulcal caries, fluoride must be present in both.
- Concern that the new anti-calculus toothpastes will prevent remineralization (i.e., healing) of early caries is ill-founded since not only does it not do so but it actually inhibits caries attack especially on root surfaces.
- Teeth which have lost substantial amounts of supporting bone from periodontal diseases can be moved orthodontically although apical root resorption can be a potential problem.
- Oral bacteria which are resistant to the efforts of fluoride are less likely to produce caries than fluoride-sensitive strains.

Patient Care

Patient Care increased during the year to a total of 50,839 visits. While non-Medicaid patient visits increased by three percent, Medicaid visits increased by eight percent. We believe that this is because fewer denitsts in private practice now accept patients for treatment under the Medicaid program and hospital dental departments in the Rochester area have limited the number of such patients that they will treat. Income from patient care increase by about nine percent.

Two issues which have come to the fore during the year are infection control and the numbers of patients with serious disease or disability. Because of potential problems with infectious diseases such as hepatitis and acquired immune-deficiency syndrome (AIDS), we have adopted barrier techniques for routine care and utilize a number of other infection-control procedures. These are becoming standard in the health professions and many are now mandated by the Federal Centers for Disease Control. While they are unquestionably necessary and effective, they have added substantially to the costs of providing care. Not only are gloves, masks, protective eyewear and disposable gowns expensive but the extra time necessary for sterilization of instruments and equipment extends the time required for each procedure.

Increasing numbers of patients with major diseases or disabilities are seeking care at the Center and many of these individuals use complex and powerful medications. As a result, medical history taking and consultation with the patient's physician have become even more critical and time consuming. We have set up a formal system of Medical Emergency Teams in the Center and they have dealt with a number of emergencies. It is interesting to note that almost as many of these incidents occurred with people just visiting the Center as with those who are actually patients. In addition to the increasing proportion of patients with medical problems, the Center provides care to a large number of individuals with physical and mental handicaps. This is due partly to the increasing numbers of such individuals in society as a consequence of New York State's "mainstreaming" policy, partly to arrangements we have made with group homes and other facilities for the handicapped, and partly to our ability and willingness to treat such patients when other dental care providers are not.

As a result of an analysis of our clinical activities and the development of a quality assurance program, we identified the potential value of having an Associate Director for Clinical Affairs. A search committee is screening applicants and we expect to make an appointment to this position in the coming year.

We learned this year that Monroe County has decided to terminate the County Dental Health Program, which the Center has operated under contract, in various forms, since 1915. While this is a regrettable decision because there is still need for this program especially in the inner city, its demise is due in large part to its success as the prevalence of caries in children has fallen dramatically in the last twenty or so years.

The Smilemobile, a mobile facility operated by the Center to provide screening and treatment for young children in the inner city since 1970, continues to be in great demand and a study confirmed the need for a second such facility. We have attempted to raise funds to purchase such a unit and, thanks to the generosity of a number of local foundations, corporations, and individual donors we now have commitments for more than \$90,000 towards the total project cost of \$175,000. The challenge of finding the remainder carries over into 1989.

Development & Communications

Development and Communications activities were very successful this year. In addition to raising funds for the Smilemobile and other special projects, the Annual Giving Campaign led by Trustee Douglass Harvey attracted a record \$70,000 + , with a gratifyingly high level of support from alumni. Many of the Center's publications were revised, and new patient brochures were printed as part of an expanded patient relations program. This latter has helped us identify areas in which improvement is needed and has demonstrated that our patients experience an encouraging level of satisfaction with the Center's clinical services. A new jury-selection system for selecting exhibiting artists for the Atrium Gallery was introduced resulting in better quality shows and greater community interest.

Staff

Although there was no change in numbers of students or full-time faculty, we did add two dental hygienist and two dental assistant positions to improve our clinical services.

Among the distinctions obtained by faculty during the year, the award to Dr. Basil G. Bibby of the American Dental Association's Gold Medal for Excellence in Dental Research was very special. This has been described as the "Nobel Prize" of dental research and it is a fitting tribute to Basil Bibby's wonderfully productive research career. Dr. Alan M. Polson chaired the important Gordon Research Conference on Periodontal Diseases, Dr. Jack G. Caton, Jr. was appointed to the American Board of Periodontology and elected a Fellow of the International College of Dentists, and I have the privilege of serving as the current President of the International Association for Dental Research (I.A.D.R.).

Several of our full-time faculty were promoted this year: Dr. John D.B. Featherstone to Senior Scientist, Dr. Jack G. Caton, Jr. to Senior Clinician, Dr. David P. Durr to Senior Clinical Associate, and Dr. Mansour Shariati to Research Associate. Additionally, we welcomed to our part-time faculty Dr. M. John Barlow, Dr. Otis J. Bouwsma, Dr. Alan H. Brodine, Dr. James R. Burk, Dr. Bryan J. Frantz, Dr. Randall K. Freeman, Dr. Lawrence F. Markus, Dr. Cynthia K. Slack and Dr. Michael A. Yunker.

Future Planning

Planning for the future occupied a good deal of time and energy this year. We crystallized plans for finishing some of the shell space in the Center's basement and for modest remodeling of some other areas, and are now seeking New York State approval to proceed. The initial steps in a new round of strategic planning have also been taken by the Senior Staff Executive Committee and by a Reactor Panel composed of a broad range of faculty, staff and students. Plans should be refined and ready for review and discussion by the Board of Trustees later in 1989.

With the projected fall in extramural grant

support in the coming year and the loss of the Monroe County Dental Health Program, we face a time of difficult financial challenge. We have taken some steps to meet this by attempting to limit utility costs through the installation of our own boiler and chiller and by other measures, but it is essential to our continuation as a research-based institution that we attract more extramural research support.

This is, of course, the end of an era as Mr. Max M. Farash completed a four-year term as President of our Board of Trustees. Max took his responsibilities to the Center very seriously and has been a most conscientious and active President. He has done a great deal to help with the improvement and efficiency of our physical plant and its proposed remodeling, he has worked hard to recruit and maintain an outstanding Board of Trustees and to make it an effective and responsive governing body, and he has helped the Center reach toward the standards of achievement and distinction that he has made his own. He leaves a legacy of which he should justifiably be proud, and for which I am deeply grateful. For me it has been a pleasure and a privilege to work closely with a person of such special caliber.

That's the best way to describe the 1987-88 Eastman Dental Center Annual Giving Campaign, which concluded on April 30, 1988.


The Campaign received \$70,194.59 in cash, pledges, and in-kind gifts, the largest total of contributions ever received in the six-year history of Dental Center annual giving.



PUBLICATIONS 1988

It was a prolific publishing year for Eastman Dental Center faculty, staff, students, alumni, and Trustees. From journal articles to book chapters to complete textbooks, nearly 60 different manuscripts were published in 1988.


