

New discovery enables gene therapy for muscular dystrophies, other disorders

Gene therapy can effectively treat various diseases, but for some debilitating conditions like muscular dystrophies, the genes that are dysfunctional are often extremely large. Scientists at the University of Rochester's Aab Cardiovascular Research Institute have discovered a new technology, dubbed "StitchR," that surmounts this obstacle by delivering two halves of a gene separately.


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Powered by passion: Bob and Mabelle Pizzutiello's story


