HeartCare



- HeartCare is the combination of two blood tests, AlloMap[®] and AlloSure[®]
- AlloMap measures the levels of 20 genes in the blood in order to determine if a patient is at a low risk for rejection.
- AlloSure measures a biomarker the blood called donor-derived cellfree DNA (dd-cfDNA). When dd-cfDNA increases, it provides an early warning sign that there could be risk for rejection.

Endomyocardial Biopsy (EMBx) and HeartCare Schedule



- ✓ Every other week, EMBx weeks 5-8
- ✓ Then start HeartCare (Allomap/Allosure), monthly blood draws with clinic visits for the first year (unless EMBx is indicated)
- ✓ At one year: LHC/ RHC with EMBx biopsy
- ✓ Second year: every 2 month visit with HeartCare (inlieu of EMBx)
- ✓ Third year: HeartCare every 3 months
- ✓ Forth year: HeartCare every 4 months
- ✓ Then HeartCare every 6 months
